
1st- Find the lead singing note on each of the chord changes

2<sup>nd</sup>- Find the Tenor note on the adjacent thinner string

3<sup>rd</sup> – Find the Baritone note on the adjacent thicker string


## I was born in East Virginia

- Q. What is the lead singing note of the word "born" when playing a C Chord on the Guitar?
- A. It is the 2<sup>nd</sup> fretted note on the 4<sup>th</sup> string (the "E" Note)




- Q. What is the Tenor Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar string going to the "thinnest" side (the "open" G string
- Q. What is the Baritone Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar sting going to the "thicker" string (the "C" note on the 5<sup>th</sup> string)

The Three harmony notes to sing on "Born"




### F C North Carolina I did go

- Q. What is the lead singing note of the word "Carolina" when playing a F Chord on the Guitar?
- A. It is the 2nd fret note on the 3rd string (the "A" Note)




- Q. What is the Tenor Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar string going to the "thinnest" side (the first fret note "C" note
- Q. What is the Baritone Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar sting going to the "thicker" string (The 3<sup>rd</sup> fretted note on the 4<sup>th</sup> string, the "F" note)




# F North Carolina I did go

- Q. What is the lead singing note of the word "Go" when playing a C Chord on the Guitar?
- A. It is the 3<sup>rd</sup> string open (the "G" Note)




- Q. What is the Tenor Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar string going to the "thinnest" side (the 2<sup>nd</sup> string fretted at the first fret, the "C" note
- Q. What is the Baritone Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar sting going to the "thicker" string (the 4<sup>th</sup> string fretted at the 2<sup>nd</sup> fret, the "E" note



## F C There I met a pretty young lady

- Q. What is the lead singing note of the word "Met" when playing a F Chord on the Guitar?
- A. It is the 2nd fret note on the 3rd string (the "A" Note)




Q. What is the Tenor Harmony note?

A. The note on the adjacent guitar string going to the "thinnest" side (the first fret note – "C" note


Q. What is the Baritone Harmony note?

A. The note on the adjacent guitar sting going to the "thicker" string (The 3<sup>rd</sup> fretted note on the 4<sup>th</sup> string, the "F" note)




## F There I met a pretty young lady

- Q. What is the lead singing note of the word "Lady" when playing a C Chord on the Guitar?
- A. It is the 5<sup>th</sup> string fretted at the third fret (the "C" note)




- Q. What is the Tenor Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar string going to the "thinnest" side (the 4<sup>th</sup> string fretted at the 2<sup>nd</sup> fret, the "E" note)
- Q. What is the Baritone Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar sting going to the "thicker" string . (The  $6^{th}$  string fretted at the  $3^{rd}$  fret .. the "G" Note)




NOTE: If the  $6^{th}$  string was played open it would be the same note as the  $4^{th}$  string fretted at the  $2^{nd}$  fret. Both would be "E" notes. Harmony would not occur since two notes would be in unison.

- Q. What is the lead singing note of the word "Name" when playing a G Chord on the Guitar?
- A. It is the open 4<sup>th</sup> String on the Guitar (the "D" note)




- Q. What is the Tenor Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar string going to the "thinnest" side (the 3<sup>rd</sup> string open or the "G" note)
- Q. What is the Baritone Harmony note?
- A. The note on the adjacent guitar sting going to the "thicker" string . (The  $5^{th}$  string fretted at the  $2^{nd}$  fret , the "B" note)



## G And Her name, I did not know

- Q. What is the lead singing note of the word "Know" when playing a C Chord on the Guitar?
- A. It is the 5<sup>th</sup> string fretted at the third fret (the "C" note)



Q. What is the Tenor Harmony note?

A. The note on the adjacent guitar string going to the "thinnest" side (the 4<sup>th</sup> string fretted at the 2<sup>nd</sup> fret, the "E" note)

Q. What is the Baritone Harmony note?

A. The note on the adjacent guitar sting going to the "thicker" string . (The  $6^{th}$  string fretted at the  $3^{rd}$  fret .. the "G" Note)
